

1. Look for the DomainKeys Icon

To determine if a message is verified:

STEP 1

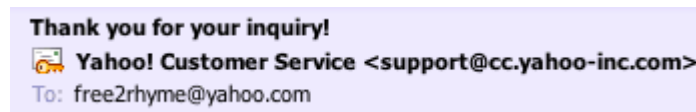
Open a message in Yahoo! Mail

Begin by opening a message in any of your Yahoo! Mail folders. It can be a new message or one you already opened.


STEP 2

Look for the DomainKeys icon

If the message has been verified through DomainKeys, you'll see a small icon of an envelope and key in the email header. This verifies that it's from the domain it claims to be from.



Notice the DomainKeys icon missing.

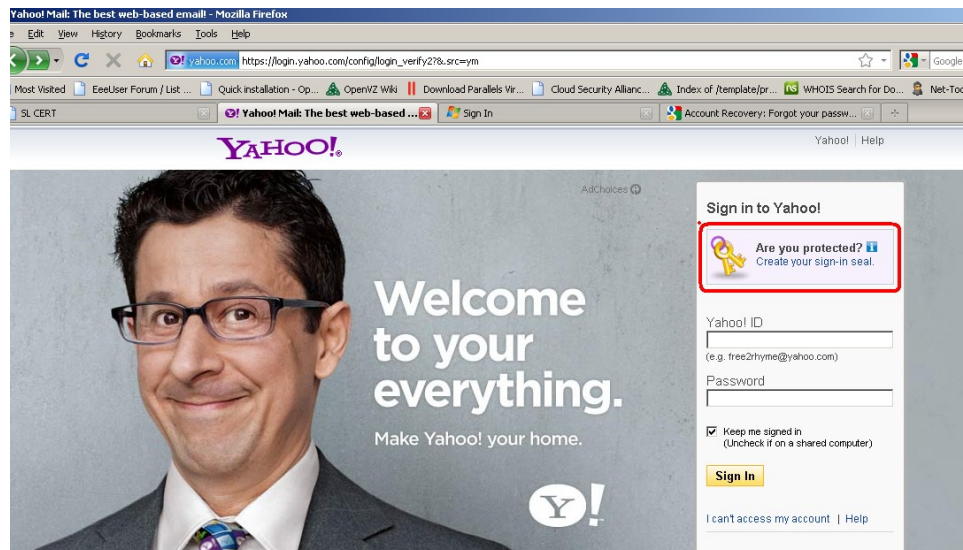
2. Fight password theft with seals you create and add to Yahoo! sign-in pages

This is how you can do it..

- a. Yahoo mail login page.

- b. Click on "Create -your sign-in-seal.



- c. Follow the instructions; you can select a text sign-in seal or an image as preferred.

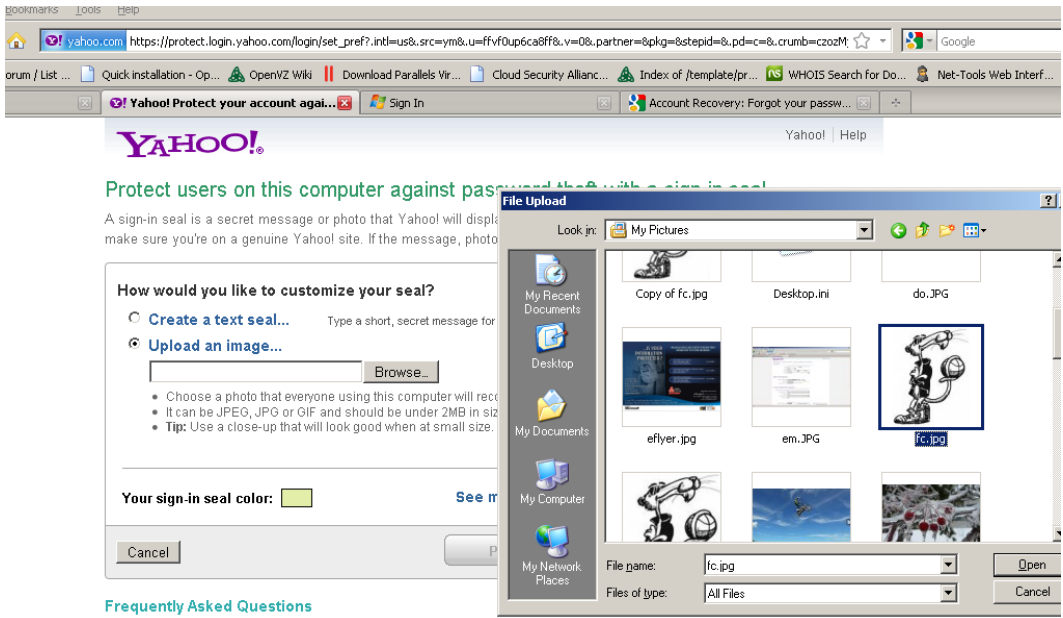

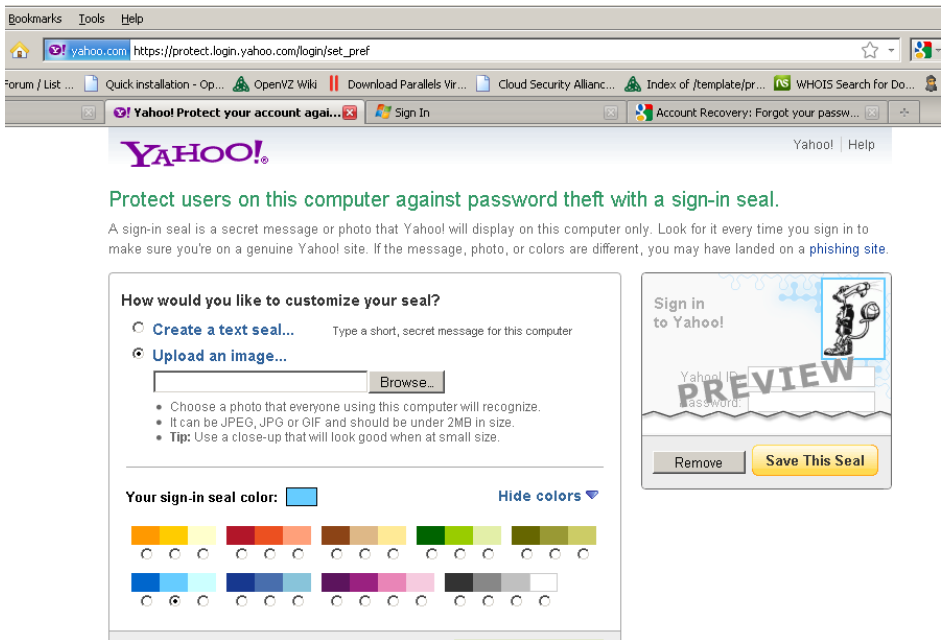
